





## **Pastoral Letter August 2022**

## Reverend Barbara Burton writes.....



Holidays have been a little bit on the back burner in recent times but some of you may have been fortunate in not only planning a holiday but managing to take one. The word "holiday" was first recorded in English around the year 950, and was written ' haligdaeg' or 'hali-daegh' (literally "holy day"). By the 15<sup>th</sup> century the 'a' became an 'o', and eventually the word became "holy day". The spelling we are familiar with, "holiday", was first recorded in 1460. Originally, the word meant a consecrated day or a religious festival. But in the 1400's, it acquired another, more secular meaning, defined as "a day in which ordinary occupations (of an individual or a community) are suspended; a day of exemption or cessation from work; a day of festivity, recreation or amusement".

What do we hope for from our holiday and what makes a good holiday? As I pondered this and, thinking back to its origins I began wondering what it would be like to take a holiday with God. What would we pack, where would we go and what conversations might we have along the way? Would we approach the holiday with excitement or apprehension or even dread? What kind of guidebook might we find useful – what wine might God like, or would we be holidaying with a teetotaller? And I wonder what the photos would be like - "here we are with God admiring a sunset, or zip-wiring across Niagara". And then what about Sunday – would there be an expectation to go to church?

Joking aside, a holiday with God is something we can all benefit from – even for just a day or part of a day. Intentionally putting aside some time to pause, ponder and pray. Time to explore and reflect on where we might be heading and what God might be calling us to be. Where will we go? Any uncluttered quiet or space is a good destination. What will we need to take with us? Nothing at all if that works for us but perhaps a book we have been wanting to read, or a journal to make notes, or something creative which we enjoy doing. What will we do? Nothing if that is what we need, or anything at all if it nourishes us. In choosing to holiday with God we choose a holy day, a sacred time put aside with a creative, hospitable, generous God who loves us and wants the best for us. A chance to step aside from the usual routine of the day and make space to see what emerges.

Whether you are holidaying at home or further afield, whether it is a day or a week or more, I hope you find rest, refreshment, and restoration.

## From the Little Yellow Smart Car



"As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."

#### **Nature Watch**

As I walked through the Church grounds last week I saw four blackbirds and two robins "sunbathing" on the church path. The birds fluff up their feathers and spread either one or both wings out from their body. They may stay in one position for some time or adopt different positions to expose different parts of their bodies to the sun.

There are several theories about why they do this, one is that lying in the sun helps with feather maintenance known as preening. As fully grown feathers are essentially dead, it is vital that the birds have a way to protect and lubricate them. Preen oil is a special substance that is secreted from a gland near the base of the tail, and it helps keep the feathers moisturised flexible and strong so they do not break in flight. The heat from the sun helps the bird to spread the preen oil around its body and along its feathers. The preen oil has antibacterial and insecticide properties, essential for keeping a bird healthy. This also gives the bird the opportunity to remove any ticks or unwanted insects from their feathers.

We are very blessed with the wildlife that we have in Norfolk and on our own front doorsteps. As well as the Roe Deer and Hares that can be seen in the fields around the village, a Hen Harrier was seen flying low over the wheat field near West Lynn. The Hen Harrier is continuing its recovery from near extinction in England. The British Trust for

Cornithology estimated (in a report last year) fewer than 700 pairs in the UK – the species' strongholds are in Orkney, Shetland, Isle of Man and the north and west of Scotland. There are up to 60 pairs in Wales. We are also blessed with having a pair of Buzzards nesting in the village, and my husband saw a Red Kite flying over our garden recently. These birds have been seen down the marsh on a number of occasions.

The hot weather is causing problems for wildlife, so if possible please leave a bowl of water in the garden for the birds and mammals. Any leftover food which is suitable, or cat and dog food can be put out for hedgehogs. I often cut up the food my cats leave in the bowl and throw it out during the day for the birds. With the ground so dry, earthworms can be hard to find and the blackbirds are quick to pick up the food.

## Clenchwarton Parish Council.

A very short report this month I'm afraid as various projects around the village are burning up my time but I hope to get back on an even keel in August. The one thing of note this month was that the Parish Council held an **extraordinary meeting on 1**<sup>st</sup> **July in** order to try and come to a consensus on what sort of questions (around a new community facility to replace the Pavilion) should be put to the village in the shape of a Parish Poll. The stand out feature of this meeting was that the Chairman, Kevin Pell, made it clear that those members of the public in attendance should also be included in the debate which was refreshing to see and be part of.

As the meeting progressed 3 questions became apparent

- Do villagers want a new building?
- Do they want to sell the Memorial Hall?
- Do they want to contribute towards the cost of the new build? As the intention is that the Poll should be independently run by the Electoral Services department at the Borough Council, it was incredibly important that everything was worded correctly and it took over 2 hours to get to a point where everyone was in agreement.

Councillors finally voted in favour of the following:

- Do you think the community should build a new multi-use community facility to replace the existing pavilion?
- Should the Memorial Hall be sold to contribute towards the cost of a new community building?
- Are you willing to contribute to the new build through your council tax if there is a shortfall?

The meeting closed around 9.10pm

### Parish Council, 7<sup>th</sup> July 2022

Even though my time is very limited to get this report done, I think it is important that I relay the reports from the County and Borough Councillors as they have the courtesy to bring this information to us every month. Cllr Kemp's report is elsewhere in this issue and Cllr Whitby reported the following; the Council has successfully prosecuted some fly-tippers and in the same vein the issue with a particular resident burning waste to the west of the village has come to a head and a legal stop on his activities has been put in place but people should still report any violations they see.

A £20m bid had been put into the levelling-up fund to renovate the Oasis in Hunstanton. If the Lynn library is relocated to the MUCH (The Multi-Use Community Hub) the existing building will be used for the community, the current date is August 2025 for completion.

### Clenchwarton Parish Council. Continued

There was also a plug for summer activities in the Guildhall which are doing several 'A play in a day' sessions for £3.

The complete minutes for this meeting will be added to the PC website sometime in the first week in August.

Finally by the time you read this the renovation of the play park should be finished plus the Jubilee Garden should be close to completion too. There's a really nice buzz about the village at the moment, not only with a resurgence in both football and lawn green bowling but also the people using the basketball nets and hard play area too. If you haven't been over to the field for a while we hope to welcome you to see for yourself how nice everything is looking when we officially open the play area on August 14th – please watch the noticeboards for more information. Thank you to everyone.

## **County Councillor Report**

#### **Incinerator Update**

I discovered 6 July's Norfolk Access Forum at County Hall had "Medworth Incinerator" in a list at the end of the agenda. I contacted the Head of Paid Service as to why it was there. The answer came back it was "for information only". So, I asked why the agenda did not say NCC opposes the incinerator, following the cross-party motion that I and Councillor Dark brought to the County Council on June 10<sup>th</sup>. The Director agreed to tell the meeting about the Council's Motion, and have this minuted. Then the very next day, Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> July, MVV sent their application for the 625,000 tonne incinerator in to HM Planning Inspectorate. The Inspectorate has 28 days to decide if it will accept the application. It won't accept it if their isn't a Statement of Adequacy of Consultation from the four host authorities who have 14 days to object.

MVV didn't consult properly with local residents, and they set too narrow a circle for the area of consultation, 5km. MVV did not hold a consultation in Clenchwarton. This was illogical, as MVV's pre-application consultation last Summer defined the area potentially affected by the incinerator at 15km. But that area is still too narrow. 15Km extends only to the Pullover Roundabout, conveniently missing out Lynn and surrounding villages like Clenchwarton, and takes no account of the velocity of the winds around the Wash as a potential carrier of particulates and secondary particulates. There is an open and flat Fen landscape between Wisbech and King's Lynn, across which particulate matter and secondary particulate matter could easily travel.

The All Parliamentary Group on Air Pollution in December called for an immediate moratorium on all new incinerators, as research shows that eggs, 10km away from incinerators, have been found to contain dioxins from incinerators. Incinerator matter has been found in children's toenails, and associated with childhood leukaemia. Tellingly, MVV's report also said they won't need to model what would happen if there was an abnormal incident, ie a major incident. This was unbelievable, when we later found out the ash from their Plymouth incinerator, blew up a ship in Plymouth Sound and injured the Chief Engineer. Legally, MVV were not responsible because the ash had left their site but that was little comfort to the ship's crew when it put their lives at risk. Incinerator ash is highly inflammable and would be a risk in transit, not just on site.

The Borough Council asked Parish Councils in West Norfolk if they were consulted. The Borough Planning Committee is discussing the matter in

July. I have asked NCC to put in a Statement of Inadequacy of Consultation and I have written to the Planning Inspectorate again.

Keep writing to the Secretary of State, Kwasi.Kwarteng.MP@Parliament.UK to say no to the incinerator and remind him there is an oversupply of them.

#### No more Incinerator Motions ever again?

There is an extremely sad and disappointing development in local politics. After the goodwill of the cross-party motion in May, NCC's Administration rushed out a raft of substantial radical changes to the Constitution, which could stop us ever bringing an Incinerator Motion, or any other Motion, to the County Council again. The detail of these new proposals was not included in the Corporate Committee's Agenda report for 23<sup>rd</sup> May – and were left off the Agenda's copy of the Constitution due to a technical error, till I pointed this out. The first proposals would have ended spontaneous questions to the leader and would have left Cabinet Members off the hook from answering questions on their portfolios. Fortunately, after strong representations from yours truly, the Administration dropped these ideas. They still want to end full County Council meetings on the dot after 3 hours (we only meet every two months as it is) and bring in a new largest group first Hierarchy of Motions. Reducing or preventing any time for any opposition motions at all. But motions and questions at full council are there for the opposition to hold the Administration to full account and to debate issues of local importance.

The changes would also mean if there is no time for your motion, it would be voted on with no debate at all or you would have to withdraw it or you could not bring it back to council for 6 months.

They also want to remove what is known as the Incinerator Clause, the requirement for decision about spending over £100 million to be brought to full council. That would be a bad move for democracy, for financial prudence and accountability. The cost of the Western Link to the new Norwich Road, that the County Council wants to build, has just gone up by £50 million to £251 million.

#### **Grain Dryer on Station Road**

The application has now been withdrawn by the applicant.

#### Norfolk County Council and Recycling.

Norfolk County Council wants to save £13 million and is thinking of closing Recycling Centres on Wednesdays, limiting spraying the weeds to once a year, and review the mobile library service. In my opinion, this would lead to less recycling and more fly tipping around Clenchwarton and I will do all I can to oppose it.



## A Canadian Experience Part 2

Undertaken by Vera and Margaret between September 23<sup>rd</sup> and October 4<sup>th</sup> 2005

We were obviously getting used to the time difference as we slept much better In the morning



When British Columbia joined the Confederation in 1871, it was on the proviso that the then Prime Minister would have a railway built to link them with the rest of the Country. The main obstacle was the Rocky Mountains. Kicking Horse Pass was eventually chosen as the route but the gradient was so steep that many accidents and some deaths occurred. One of the railways' engineers came up with the idea of the Spiral Tunnels based on a system used in Switzerland. This amazing feat of engineering opened in 1909 and with the gentler gradient the descents became safer and delays and costs were reduced.

Following this we climbed higher and higher up the Kicking Horse valley, the coach having to reverse up one section as he could not take the bend. We arrived at Takkakaw Falls, one of the highest falls in Canada, and walked along the trail. After descending we crossed the Kicking Horse River, spotting a little bird on the rocks. It was a Dipper but not the same as our British bird. We travelled to Emerald Lake, so green, just as its name describes. We walked the lakeside path, looking across at Mount Burgess (8,527 ft). Fossils have been found nearby on Mount Dennis, known as the Burgess shales. Fossils of some 120 different types of soft bodied creatures which are more than 515 million years old. The site has been designated as a Unesco World Heritage Site. Back to the hotel in Banff for a bath then out to eat.

Day five began with a 6.30 am alarm call as we had a train to catch. It had snowed in the night and began again as we arrived at Banff station, magical – just like Christmas!. We left Banff on the famous 'Rocky Mountaineer' with Michael serving us breakfast and lunch. He also pointed out interesting views and wildlife as we travelled. We passed Castle Mountain and Lake Louise, followed by wonderful views of the Mount Victoria Glacier at 11,365 ft. Mount Stephen followed (10,495 ft), which was named after George Stephen, the first President of the Canadian Pacific Railway, born in Dufftown, Scotland.

We travelled by the beautiful glacial Lake Wapta, which, at 5,200 ft above sea level, was the source of the Kicking Horse River. We then headed towards the Spiral Tunnels and an interesting part of the journey. Passing through the town of Golden, we followed the Columbia River. The railway goes through Roger's Pass, named after the line's surveyor and engineer, Major A B Rogers.

Over the next ten miles the train crossed three bridges: 1) Mountain Creek Bridge, made with 1,500,000 pieces of timber, built from 1884 to 1889, it is 164 ft high and 1,086 ft long. 2) Surprise Creek Bridge, a wooden trestle bridge built between 1887 and 1889, 180 ft high and 416 ft long. 3) Stoney Creek Bridge, originally wooden but replaced in 1895 by a steel bridge, it towers 325 ft above the creek with a span of 484 ft.

A couple of miles further we entered the Connaught Tunnel, built to avoid the heavy snowfalls and avalanches and completed in 1916. It was named after the then Governor General, the Duke of Connaught. We continued through the Glacier and Revelstoke National P-arks then crossed the Eagle River Bridge to Craigellachie and on to Sicamous, home of more than 300 houseboats. Passing through the Salmon Bay Nature Reserve we saw Ospreys and Bald Eagles. Scattered on route were unique rock and clay formations called hoodoes, formed after the last ice age.

Along the South Thompson River bank we passed the site of the Great Train Robbery. It was here that Bill Miner and his gang made their last robbery in Canada, they botched the attempt and got away with just \$15 and a few liver pills!

Eventually we reached the town of Kamloops where we will spend the night after a very interesting and enjoyable day.


